MINUS HIS MONEY.

A Wealthy Ranchman Loses Five Hundred Dollars.

An old gentleman named Elisha Duncan, who lives on a ranch not far from Denver, has been in the city for the past few days on an extended spree. Duncan is in good circumstances and has a very healthy bank account. He deals in stock to a considerable extent and is well known to a large number of people.

While on the grand rounds here he fell in with a man named Myer Reihnstrom, and the two became confidential friends and were a good deal together. On Wednesday Duncan drew \$500 from the bank, put it in his pocket and continued his spree, in com-

pany with Reihnstrom. After quite a protracted siege, Duncan ended up at Bailey's Bull's Head corral, on Sixteenth and Wazee streets, minus the \$500 that he had placed in his pocket the day previous. Reihnstrom was missing and Duncan placed the case in the hands of Detective Hawley, of the Rocky Mountain Detective association, who is in possession of clues that will likely lead to the fugitive's apprehension.
