DIED.

In Loveland, November 16, in the 48th year of life, Zachary Taylor passed on from what we here call life to the real life of which we suppose—but know naught.

Zachary Taylor was born in Keesport, Illinois, April 22, 1851—and has been a resident of this vicinity since early in the 70s. In 1875 (February 18) he was married to Miss Winona, only daughter of J E and Albina L Washburn. The wedding was a notable one—occurring as it did at an open meeting of the Big Thompson Grange.

To this couple were born nine children—six of whom are now living: Everett Washburn, Nellie Albina, Estes Park, Laura Winnie, Luella, and Cliff Curtis. Mr Taylor was, to use the expression so common among his friends, “a good man—an honest man.” He was a hard worker, a man of push and perseverance, but had suffered numerous financial reverses: yet, withal, he was always cheerful and happy—and always kind to his family.

His funeral, conducted by the Fraternal Aid Association—of which he was a beneficiary and a charter member—was held at two o'clock Sunday afternoon, from the christian church.
